The Episcopal Peace Fellowship is a national organization that brings Episcopalians together to do justice, dismantle violence, and strive to be peacemakers. We pray, study & act to build peace and justice in our communities, our church & our world.

What We Do: (highlights)

Young Adult Initiative coordinates the growing group of young adults who are committed to peace and justice. YAI Programs include the Young Presence at General Convention and multiple Urban Pilgrimages conducted during spring break for college and post college young adults.

Palestine Israel Network (PIN) is the action arm of EPF dedicated to a robust Episcopal Church witness for justice and peace for our Palestinian and Israeli brothers and sisters. PIN has produced an Episcopal version of Steadfast Hope: a 50 page book with a DVD ready to order at the EPF web site.

Action Groups have been formed around the following issues: Gun Violence Prevention, Death Penalty Abolition, Conscientious Objectors, Nuclear Abolition and Care for Creation. Action groups offer projects and resources with suggestions on how to take action on these issues.

Chapters & Peace Partner Congregations:

EPF chapters work on local peace initiatives in their parish, communities, nationally & internationally. Chapters sponsor prayer vigils & public witnesses. Peace Partner Congregations work within their parishes and communities to raise up the issues of peace and justice.

Nonviolence Resources include an on-line tool kit with 'how to' nonviolence resources. EPF also supports nonviolence training with the Diocese of Haiti.

General Convention:

EPF actively witnesses with an exhibit, resolutions, testimony to insure that the Episcopal Church continues in its work and witness for peace and justice.
