Despite disappointment about a shortened General Convention with limited attendance, PIN fully participated in online legislative committee testimony that contributed to passing several important resolutions.

The Cotton Fite Award honored the Rev. Canon Dr. Richard Toll and the John Nevin Sayre Award honored Dr. Linda Gaither.

PIN restructured itself to work more nimbly and broaden our reach into parishes, dioceses, and allied communities.

PIN rejoiced in the unification of Palestinians throughout the Palestinian homeland and diaspora in resisting Zionist settler-colonialism, and we despaired at the continuing violence and oppression of the occupation.
