#### Local Organizing and Voting on PIN Resolutions Goes Forward at Fall Diocesan Conventions

In October and November, resolutions relating to the growing crisis for Palestinian human rights were on the agenda at the yearly conventions in three dioceses: Pennsylvania, Rochester and Chicago. At all three conventions, the backdrop for debate and vote was the violence, destruction and death that began with the Hamas attack on Oct. 7 and expanded exponentially with Israel's assault on Gaza deploying massive ordinance and heavy bombardment by IDF pilots flying the latest American jets.

The resolution presented to the Diocese of Pennsylvania, titled "A Call for Ending Apartheid Against Palestinians," directed the 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church to "call on the Office of Government Relations to represent ending Israel's apartheid as a policy priority of The Episcopal Church and to influence policy and legislation on this issue."

The resolution was adapted from a model PIN resolution by members of the Philadelphia group, Christian & Jewish Allies, working together with representatives of EPF PIN and Kairos Palestine USA on a project called "Organizing for Palestine from the Church Grassroots." C&J Allies organized persuasive online testimony and floor testimony at convention, while mobilizing support at the grassroots. After months of hard work, the final count fell short by just 17 votes. The polarized atmosphere led supporters to believe that the vote might have gone the other way prior to Oct. 7.

In the Diocese of Rochester, a resolution entitled "On Responsible Travel to the Holy Land," adapted an EPF PIN model resolution to ask the 81st General Convention to "recommend that pilgrimage travelers to the Holy Land explore and engage the realities of the circumstances and conditions impacting the lives of today's Palestinians and Israelis, paying particular attention to the Israeli military Occupation of Palestinian territories, to the violations of human rights, and to Palestinian national aspirations."

The Convention was virtual and there was no pre-convention testimony. During debate, opposing voices were strident; there were motions to table, postpone and/or amend the resolution, none of which prevailed. The resolution was adopted with 51% voting in favor. It will be sent forward to General Convention for debate and vote.

In the Diocese of Chicago, a resolution entitled "Solidarity with the Palestinian Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions Movement" came to a final vote after a last-minute substitute resolution was rejected. Abstentions were requested and allowed on this resolution only. Lay deputies narrowly approved the resolution (91 yes, 89 no, 44 abstentions) but clergy defeated it (50 yes, 60 no, 15 abstentions). After a model campaign, with educational events around the diocese prior to convention, the organizers judged that BDS may well have been affirmed if not for the fallout from Oct. 7, especially since the diocese already affirmed that Israel is an apartheid state at a previous convention.
